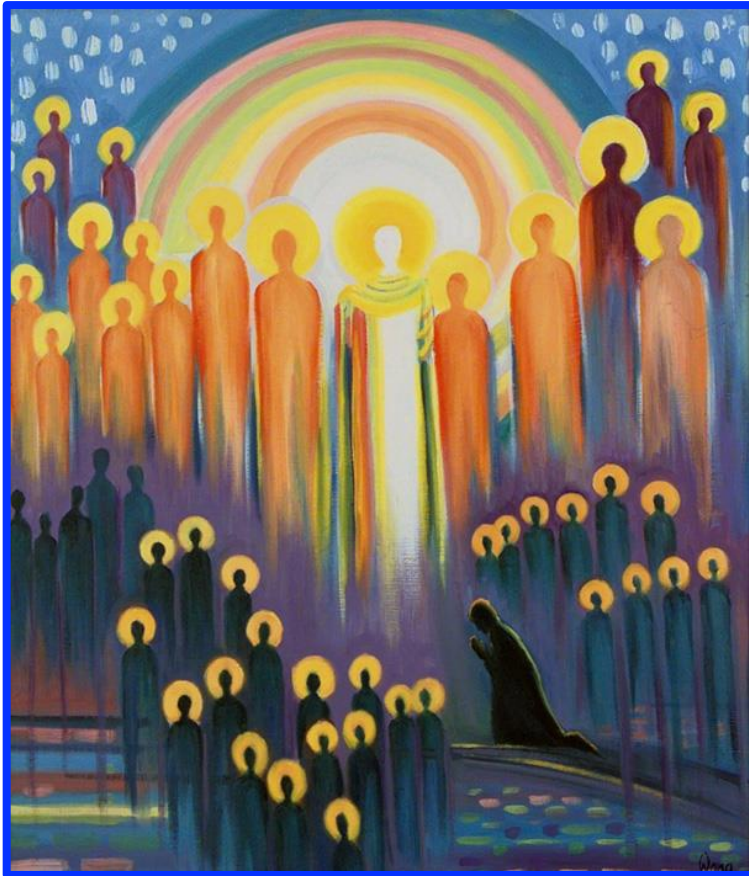

The Gospel

John 11:32-44

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?"

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone.

And Jesus looked upward and said, "Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth,

and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

Priest At our baptism we joined the larger family of saints throughout the ages. I call upon you, therefore as we celebrate the feast of All Saints to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism.

Priest Do you believe in God the Father?

People *I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.*

Priest Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People *I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He*

*ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.*

Priest Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People *I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.*

Priest Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Priest Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People *I will, with God's help.*
